Team and Individual Show Jumping

Classes 3 - 6 are qualifiers for the 2025 Pony Club Mini Championships

Class 1 Mini Jumping individuals LEAD REIN/ASSISTED. Poles

Class 2 Mini Jumping Individuals LEAD REIN/ASSISTED 30cm

Maybe split if entries allow. Mix of cross poles & straights

Class 3 Teams and Individuals LEAD REIN/ASSISTED 40cm

Maybe split if entries allow. To qualify Lead Rein to be 10yrs & under on 1.1.2024
& Assisted to be 12yrs & under on 1.1.2024

Class 4 Teams and Individuals NO ASSISTANCE 40cm

Class 5 Teams and Individuals 50cm

Class 6 Teams and Individuals 60cm

Class 7 Teams and Individuals 70cm

Class 8 Teams and Individuals 80cm

Rules

Entries are accepted and admission granted only subject to the following conditions and it is a condition of entry that these have been accepted by each competitor.

All classes will be run in accordance with Pony Club Showjumping Rules 2024. You can view the rules at www.pcuk.org.

If the rider sustains a suspected head injury or concussion within three weeks of the event they will withdraw from the event.

Organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers and all the officials and stewards.

Legal Liability Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event or The Pony Club nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord or his tenant, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis

The Judge's decision is final and any objections must be accompanied by £25 deposit which will be returned if upheld. Horse/Pony must be 4 years or over on day of show. All dogs must be kept on lead.

The Organisers reserve the right to refuse entry without stating a reason and to eliminate any competitor who in their opinion places themselves or others in danger or fails to observe the rules.

Whip Rule:

Use of the whip At all times, the whip must only be used for a good reason,

- as an aid to encourage the horse forward.
- At an appropriate time, namely when the horse is reluctant to go forward under normal aids of seat and legs.
- In the right place, namely down the shoulder or behind the leg but never overarm.
- With appropriate severity.
- No more than twice for any one incident. Excessive use of the whip anywhere on the showground will result in disqualification:
- Use of the whip to vent a competitor's anger is always excessive.
- Use of a whip which causes injury eg. Broken skin or a weal, is always excessive.
- Use after elimination or retirement is always excessive.
- Use on a horse's head, neck etc. is always excessive.
- Using the whip from the ground after a rider fall or dismount is always excessive.
- If the rider's arm comes above the shoulder when using the whip, this is always excessive.

Spurs

Spurs must only be used to enhance the normal leg aids and allow for better communication from rider to horse. Spurs must never be used to vent a competitor's anger or to reprimand the horse. Use of the spurs which causes injury eg. blood, broken skin or a weal, is always classed as misuse. Misuse of the spurs anywhere on the showground will result in disqualification

General Guidelines for Team Show Jumping

- Tack and Hat check at warm up arenas
- Teams will be of three or four riders best three scores will count.
- LEAD REIN RIDERS - must remain on the lead rein at all times whilst in the ring including entering and leaving the ring and whilst warming up.
Any breach will incur a 10 point penalty.
- ASSISTED TEAMS - One adult is allowed to assist in the ring whilst the competitor jumps his/her round. PLEASE NOTE - No contact to be made with rider or pony whilst in the ring including entering and leaving the ring.
Any breach will incur a 10 point penalty.
- One competitor may ride no more than two horses/ponies in the same team each horse/pony may only compete once
